**S**ean Rasmus has soared to the heights of his profession, real-estate sales. He's made Re/Max's international roster of 25 top-selling agents and been named number three on *Realtor Magazine's* annual list of megaproducers. He and his wife, Jude, now operate a Marietta company specializing in foreclosed properties. "You never know what it's going to be," he says. "A \$2-million house that's been stripped of kitchen cabinets, appliances and stereo equipment—or a double-wide where they steam-cleaned the carpet before they left." Looted or tidied, Rasmus moves over 1,000 every year.
